4th International Graduate Summer Institute for the Cultural Study of the Law

August 6 – 18, 2012

The 4th International Summer Institute for the Cultural Study of the Law aims to further encourage and promote the interdisciplinary study and research of the interrelations between law and culture, based on the idea that the extended cultural study of the law will encourage profitable scholarly exchange and dialogue between legal studies and the humanities.

The Osnabrück Summer Institute will bring together leading scholars from law and the humanities concerned with the relation between law and culture with international graduate students from the humanities, legal studies, the social and political sciences, art and history, in order to create a high profile opportunity for the comparative study of law and culture and their complex relation. The Institute aims at an effective combination of workshops, lectures, panels and presentations, both by faculty members from the participating institutions and a number of guest lecturers, specifically selected as leading experts in their respective fields. The Institute will offer a total of four workshops for 30-35 international graduate students over a two-week period.

Confirmed faculty for the 2012 Summer Institute include: Rosemary Coombe (York U, Canada), Fiona MacMillan (Birkbeck Law, UK), Helle Porsdam (U of Copenhagen, Denmark), Joseph Slaughter (Columbia U, USA), and Kay Schaffer (U. of Adelaide, Australia).

We are inviting qualified students from all over the world whose work is concerned with the interdependence and interaction between law and culture to join a unique experience of scholarly collaboration and exchange during an intensive two-week program with workshops, public lectures, panel discussions and excursions.
